ANU - New Bachelor of Digital Arts program for 2011

The ANU School of Arts has developed a new Bachelor of Digital Arts program for 2011. The new Bachelor of Digital Arts offers students practical study in areas of digital media such as 3D computer animation, digital video, digital compositing and visual effects, interactivity, the internet and sound.

Students of the Bachelor of Digital Arts program undertake a foundational year in digital media and the creative art whilst specialised digital media instruction is delivered in the context of digital storytelling and hybrid digital practice. In the final year of study, students can establish their own area of specialization and produce a major digital art work in animation, video, sound, or internet art; or take a 'hybrid' approach by blending these disciplines together in new and exciting ways.

The Bachelor of Digital Arts immediately gives graduates crucial skills used throughout the computer, film and media industries of Australia. Graduates are eligible for an honours year and further research in digital media at Masters and PhD level is available.

University of Wollongong Management Cadetships

The University's Management Cadetship combines work and study. Cadets work in a number of areas across the University including Personnel, Finance, Marketing, Audit, Policy & Governance and Student Administration. Successful applicants undertake a relevant undergraduate degree majoring in areas such as Management, Marketing, Finance, Accounting or Business Information Systems. Other areas of study may be acceptable if they are considered compatible with the work placements of the cadetship.

During the final two years of the Cadetship, cadets undertake a specialised placement relating to their degree major which gives the cadet the edge in becoming a 'young professional' in their chosen field.

Cadets receive an annual salary with increments each year, plus an education allowance covering course and student body fees and a book allowance. Cadets are allocated 10 hours study leave per week during session to attend lectures and tutorials.

John Hall Venice Course – live in Venice for 6 weeks

The [John Hall Venice Course](#) gives students the opportunity to live in Venice for 6 weeks to learn about and experience European history, culture, and art.

The course involves lectures from experts in their field; university professors, curators, critics, conductors, theatre directors, writers, and private visits to places when closed to the public: the National Gallery in London; St.Mark’s by night in Venice; in Florence the Uffizi and Accademia Galleries; in Rome the Villa Borghese Gallery, the Vatican Museums and the Sistine Chapel.

The majority of students on the Course are from British schools, mostly coming as part of their Gap year. Together with students from many other countries, the community has an interesting international dimension. With long-distance travel so easy and inexpensive many students who attend the Venice Course go on to back-pack all over the world, loaded not only with water bottles but with a totally new awareness of global issues of today and tomorrow and of what European civilization is about.
